EVENT DESCRIPTION

CHIEF SCRUTINEER

OH&SOFFICER

The event will be a **Multi-Club Hillclimb** to be conducted at Rob Roy Hillclimb, Clintons Road, Christmas Hills (Melway 265 A9), on Sunday 18th November 2018, over a distance of 670 metres in a single direction.

ENTRIES

ENTRIES OPEN WITH THE PUBLICATION OF THESE REGULATIONS AND CLOSE ON TUESDAY 13th NOVEMBER 2018. THE ENTRY FEE IS \$100. The entry fee for Junior drivers is \$50. Preferred entry is via the CAMS Event Entry which is available at: - www.cams.com.au However traditional entry type forms are attached to these regulations. If used, entry forms must be completed in full, accompanied by the entry fee and received by the Meeting Secretary by **5pm on the stated closing date**. A refund of the entry fee may be allowed for entries withdrawn prior to the closing date, by notifying the Meeting Secretary. Entries withdrawn after this date will not receive a refund. THERE WILL BE NO ENTRIES ACCEPTED AFTER THE CLOSING DATE.

The Promoter reserves the right to stipulate the number of entries for this event, and accept entries in excess of such number at their absolute discretion. The maximum number of entries shall be 105, accepted in order of receipt. The Promoter reserves the right to refuse any entry in accordance with NCR 83 of the current CAMS Manual of Motor Sport.

INSURANCE

Certain public, property, professional indemnity and personal accident insurance is provided by CAMS in relation to the event. Further details can be found in the CAMS Insurance Handbook, available at www.cams.com.au.

COMPETITION

<u>There will be no official timed practice</u>. However, a FAMILIARITY RUN will be conducted immediately following the Drivers Briefing, for drivers who have not competed at Rob Roy previously. This restriction is being done to save time so we can maximise the number of runs on the day. Your cooperation with this will be greatly appreciated.

All runs on the day will be deemed as official, with the total number of runs dependent on the number of competitors entered and the number of track time interruptions (i.e. sweeping, recoveries etc.). At 2.00 pm an announcement will be made as to what will be the total number of official runs for the event

One issue that limits the number of runs we can achieve on the day is how quickly a competitor enters the Return Road, as this is the trigger for the start of the next competitor run. Please view "Entering the Return Road" Memorandum at the following link.

PERSONS ELIGIBLE

The event will be open to members of clubs affiliated with CAMS who are holders of a current CAMS Level 2SJ or superior licence.

PARENTAL CONSENT

If any competitor or driver is under 18 years of age, the consent of his/her parent or guardian must appear on the entry form.

SCRUTINY

Scrutiny will commence at 7.00am and conclude at 8.30am on the day. All vehicles must be scrutineered and passed for competition prior to participation. Current CAMS Licences, Competition Records and CAMS Log Books (if issued), associated Certificate of Description (Category 5 cars only excluding Group S and Group N), and current Club Membership Cards must be produced at scrutiny and on request during the meeting.

DRIVERS BRIEFING

THE ATTENDANCE OF ALL DRIVERS IS COMPULSORY AT THE DRIVERS BRIEFING TO BE HELD AT 8.30am ON THE DAY. All Drivers must sign a *Drivers Briefing Attendance Sheet* after the Drivers Briefing.

TIMING

Timing will be electronic, and be accurate to 1/100th of a second. Class winners will be those competitors with the fastest time for a single run in each class. In the event of a tie, the next fastest official time of each competitor will determine the class winner. Timekeepers will be considered Judges of Fact.

COMPETITION NUMBERS

Competitors' permanent numbers will be accepted <u>where possible</u>. Please advise if this is the case. In all other cases, car numbers will be allocated in order of receipt. Please note that numbers must be shown on BOTH sides of your vehicle. Numbers will be available for sale at the Secretary's office.

TURN 2 TRACKSIDE MARKER (Referred to as the Noodle)

A noodle has recently been installed at the apex of Turn 2, and time penalties will be applied to anyone that hits the noodle, as cutting a corner shortens the course and is therefore deemed an unfair advantage.

A time penalty of 5 seconds will be applied to anybody that hits the noodle. Officials located at Turn 2 will be Judges of Fact in this regard and report back through Race Control for the penalty to be applied.

PROTESTS

Any protests must be lodged in accordance with Part XII of the NCR's.

ABANDONMENT

The Promoter reserves the right to abandon, postpone or cancel this event in accordance with NCR 59 of the current CAMS Manual of Motor Sport.

REFUELLING OF VEHICLES

This may only be carried out in the designated refuelling area located in the centre lane of the Scrutiny Bay. Refuelling is to be done by 2 persons, one of which is to man a suitable fire extinguisher. NO REFUELLING IS TO BE CARRIED OUT IN THE PITS OR PADDOCK.

SAFETY - CARS

The attention of competitors is drawn to Schedules A & B of the current CAMS Manual of Motor Sport, in which all vehicle requirements are listed in detail. Vehicles must be fitted with a fire extinguisher complying with Schedule H of the current CAMS Manual of Motor Sport. Competitors are reminded that the possession and use of Halon/BCF fire extinguishers, other than where specific approval has been given by the E.P.A., is prohibited. Fuel must be in accordance with Schedule G of the current CAMS Manual of Motor Sport.

SAFETY - DRIVERS

Drivers must wear a helmet to a standard listed in the current CAMS Manual of Motor Sport, and be deemed by the scrutineers of the event to be in a suitable condition for motor sport use, non-flammable clothing, including cover from ankles to wrist to throat, suitable footwear, and goggles or visors with lens other than glass in open cars (see Schedule D of the current CAMS Manual of Motor Sport).

NOISE

All competing cars must be fitted with a device that restricts the exhaust noise level to a maximum of 95dB(A) measured at a distance of 30 metres on a drive by test under full acceleration. Vehicles may be checked during practice and competition. Any competitor's car that exceeds this limit will be warned. A second offence may result in expulsion from the remainder of the meeting.

DAMAGE

The cost of rectifying any damage caused by a competing car to the protective barriers and other infrastructure at the venue will be charged to the driver concerned.

ACCEPTANCE OF ENTRIES

Notification of acceptance of entry will be forwarded to all competitors during the week prior to the event. This advice will also include any additional necessary information.

PARKING

Please note: It is mandatory for all competing vehicles to be located in the pit area uphill from the Octunda unless by prior arrangement and or advice. No tender vehicles or trailers are to remain in the pit area after unloading.

Additionally, no tender vehicles or trailers are permitted in the pit area for the purpose of loading a vehicle while competition is underway.

Tender vehicle and trailer park is adjacent to the spectator parking area on the hill to the right of the entry road. Please refer to the circuit map that will be attached to Acceptance Letters.

ALCOHOL, DRUGS AND OTHER SUBSTANCES

Any holder of a CAMS 'Competition' or 'Officials' licence (or equivalent licence issued by another ASN) may be tested for the presence of drugs (or other banned substances) and subject to a penalty(ies) for a breach in accordance with the CAMS Anti-Doping Policy and/or the CAMS Illicit Drugs in Sport (Safety Testing) Policy as published on the CAMS website. Consumption of alcohol in the paddock, pits or any section of the competition venue/course under the control of the Officials is forbidden until all competition is concluded each day. Accordingly, any holder of a CAMS 'Competition' or 'Officials' licence (or equivalent licence issued by another ASN) may also be tested for the presence of alcohol by a CAMS Accredited Testing Official (CATO) in accordance with the CAMS Standard Operating Procedure for Breath Alcohol Testing.
